- The Upper House of Myanmar's parliament approved a Bill on 1 April 2016 to give more powerful role over the country's parliament and government to **Aung San Suu Kyi**.
- President Pranab Mukherjee on 1 April 2016 signed ordinance to authorize expenditure beyond April 1 in Uttarakhand which is under **President's rule**.
- Union Government launched a Mobile App to empower People to demand 24x7 Power for the states on 31 March 2016 **Vidyut PRAVAH**.
- The administration of **National Capital Territory of Delhi** launched the Phase I of 'Green Initiative' at an estimated cost of 2 crore rupees.
- **Bio-Medical Waste** (Management and Handling) Rules, 2016 were notified by the Union Government to properly manage the 484 tons per day bio-medical waste from 168869 healthcare facilities (HCFs) across the country.
- The Legislative Assembly of **Haryana** passed a bill prescribing minimum educational qualifications to contest for urban local bodies.
- Union Ministry of Commerce and Industry launched the Startup India portal and mobile app in New Delhi on 31 March 2016
- The theme of the International Day of Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action that was observed on 4 April 2016 across the world is **Mine Action is Humanitarian Action**.
- The 2016 Nuclear Security Summit concluded on 1 April 2016 in Washington, D.C., United States
- **Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore** was adjudged as the top university in India as per the India Rankings 2016 released under National Institutional Ranking Framework.
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in its first bi-monthly monetary policy review for the 2016-17 fiscal on 5 April 2016 cut key interest rates by **25 basis points**.
- Delhi High Court in Joginder Singh vs State (NCT of Delhi) on 4 April 2016 held that keeping a criminal case pending for indefinite period amounts to violation of constitutional rights of the accused under **Article 21** (**right to life**).
- The subsidiary of Vedanta Limited, **Talwandi Sabo Power Limited**, officially set the Guinness World Record for simultaneously planting 208751 saplings at a single location in less than an hour.
- Odisha government launched its first set of 100 English-medium schools in 14 districts under the aegis of **Odisha Adarsha Vidyalaya**.
- The great Indian Mathematician & Astronomer whose statue was unveiled at UNESCO headquarters on 6 April 2016 is Aryabhatta.
- Myanmar's (Burmese) Parliament in Naypyidaw on 5 April 2016 passed a bill that gives Aung San Suu Kyi the post of state counselor, which is similar to that of Prime Minister.
- Syria, Yemen and Iraq are greatest emergency areas wherein 125 million people are living in crisis according to a World Health Organization report.
- Cyclone Zena forced Fiji authorities to issue orders asking peoples to stay inside their homes.
- In UK, Britain's Royal Mail launched a set of special postage stamps on 5 April 2016 to mark the 400th anniversary of the death of the playwright William Shakespeare.
- The Cabinet sub-committee on scarcity of Gujarat declared 623 villages as scarcity affected.

- The electricity regulatory commission of Madhya Pradesh approved an average hike of eight percent in power tariff.
- Union Minister of State for Textiles, Santosh Kumar Gangwar inaugurated the Apparel and Garment making Centre at District Industries Centre Complex in Dimapur, Nagaland.
- Under the first Bi-Monthly Monetary Policy Statement 2016-17, the repo rate was reduced by 25 basis points to 6.5 percent.
- The Union Ministry of Environment Forests and Climate Change on 5 April 2016 notified Solid Management Rules, 2016, which will replace Municipal Solid Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2000.
- India's expenditure on military in 2015 was 51.3 billion dollars, as per a study of the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI). This was 3.1% of global spending.
- The researchers of American University successfully managed to 3D print chemically active structures that could help in mitigating pollution.
- Ranjan Baindoor, who was part of the Ranji Trophy-winning Mumbai team of 1983-84 under Sunil Gavaskar, died on 4 April 2016.
- Indian scientists developed eco-friendly nanotechnology which is basically a biopolymer, which uses a naturally occurring substance for water purification Chitosan.
- The Beausejour Cricket Ground in St Lucia of West Indies on 6 April 2016 was renamed as **Darren Sammy** National Cricket Stadium.
- The Union Cabinet gave approval to Exim Bank of India for increasing the framework agreement with **Central Bank of Iran**.
- The Union Cabinet gave its approval to implement **National Hydrology Project** that provides for establishment of National Water Informatics Centre (NWIC) as an independent organization.
- Jharkhand State Government that announced two percent employment reservation in various departments for meritorious sportspersons of the state on 10 April 2016.
- World number two shuttler Kento Momota of Japan was axed from Japan's badminton team for the 2016 Rio Olympics for Gambling at an illegal casino.
- Chinese researchers in April 2016 introduced a new approach for making an all-weather solar cell that can generate electricity even during rains by making use of Graphene.
- Scientists, led by an Indian-origin researcher, discovered a way to forecast earthquakes based on slow fault movements caused by moving sub layers of Earth Deepa Mele Veedu.
- A four-member Indian professional boxing team which will compete in the WBA Oceanic undercard bouts in Jinghong, China on 11 April 2016 are Mukesh Kumar, Rajesh Kumar, Sandeep Singh and Pramod Kumar.
